

Three-Year Postdoctoral Fellowship



Princeton Fellowships in Experimental Physics (PFEP)

The Physics Department aims to recruit and support exceptional recent PhD recipients in experimental physics through a three-year honorific postdoctoral fellowship program. Nominees from all areas of experimental physics will be considered and selected through an annual competition. The selected scholars are expected to work with the existing experimental groups in the department, although those who wish to pursue a specific independent research program will also be considered. Princeton has experimental research programs in Atomic Physics, Biophysics, Condensed Matter Physics, Cosmology & Gravitation, High Energy Physics, and Particle Astrophysics.

This year the Physics Department will select two scholars. We anticipate reaching a steady state of six scholars. One of the scholars will be selected as a Dicke Fellow, in recognition of Princeton physicist Robert Dicke. In addition to salary and benefits, the program will provide a discretionary fund of \$6,600 per year for each scholar. Candidates who are not selected for a PFEP will be considered for other postdoctoral positions.
